**Term coined by Cory Doctorow:**

Describes platform decay as they shift value from users to themselves.

Goal is to be a platform nobody can escape that you need to pay to use forever.

Has bled over to other products like TV and that's why you need a million subscriptions.

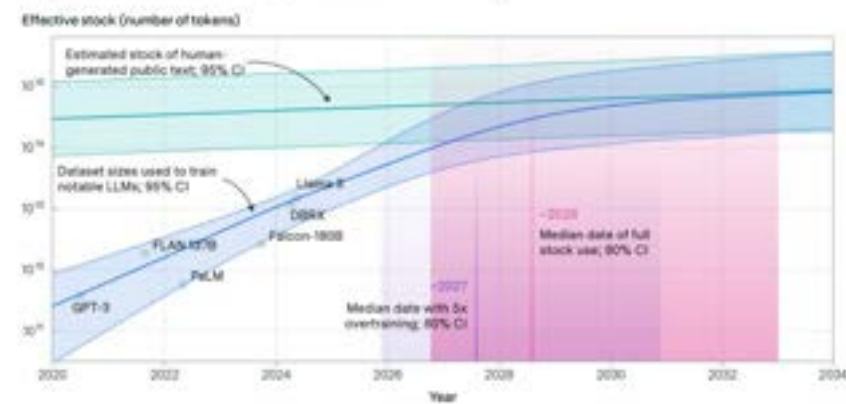

## How the AI industry profits from catastrophe

As the demand for data labeling exploded, an economic catastrophe turned Venezuela into ground zero for a new model of labor exploitation.

Social media content and AI training data are processed in outsource centres in the global south, where long hours, low pay and exposure to disturbing material are the norm

Unlike in 2009, when the main crowdsourcing platform was Amazon's Mechanical Turk, there is currently an explosion of data labeling companies. These companies are raising tens to hundreds of millions in venture capital funding while the data labelers have been estimated to make an average of **\$1.77 per task**. Data labeling interfaces have evolved to treat crowdworkers like machines, often prescribing them highly repetitive tasks, **surveilling their movements** and **punishing deviation through automated tools**. Today, far from an academic challenge, large corporations claiming to be "AI first" are fueled by this army of underpaid gig workers, such as data laborers, content moderators, warehouse workers and delivery drivers.

**Smart, personalised autocorrect**

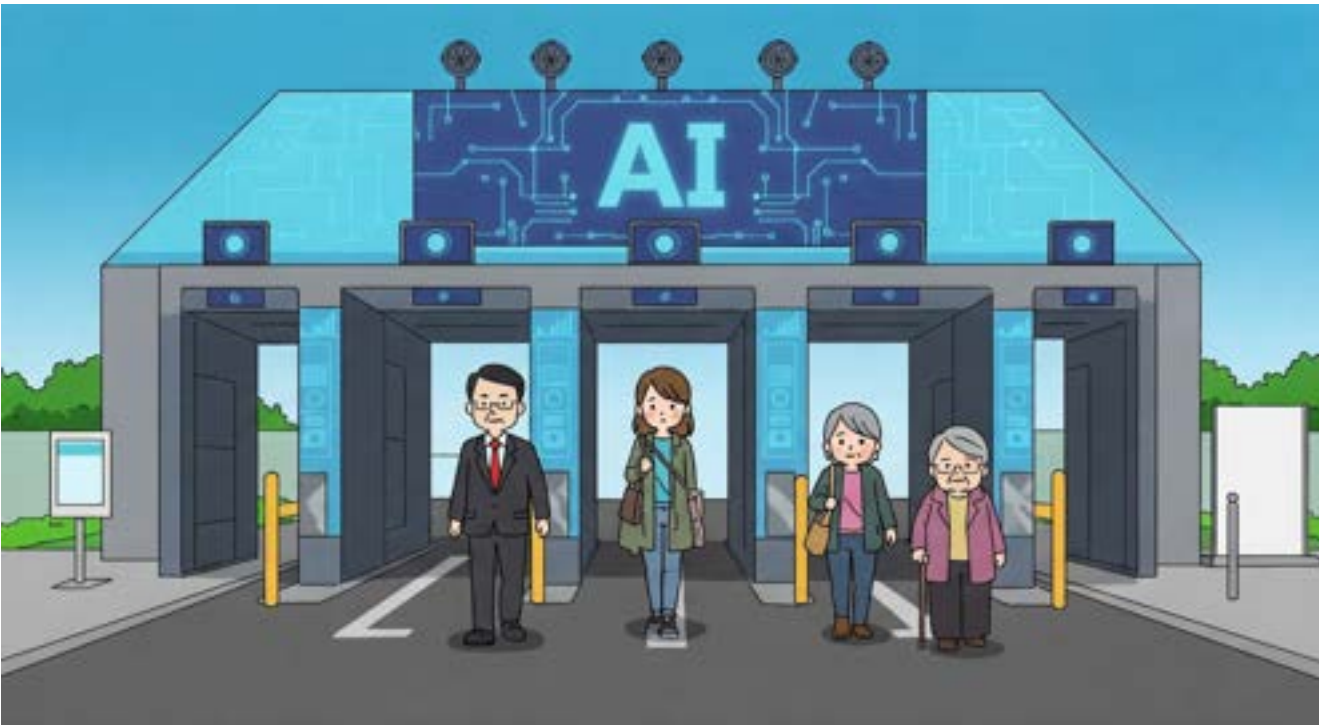
**Helpful image tools**

# Fix 1: Voting With Your Wallet

1. Buy Local, Buy Small Business
2. Avoid Monopolies
3. Ask Some Questions:
  - a. My Data: Where is it stored? How long is it stored? Can I have it deleted?
  - b. Data Portability: Can I export my data and take it somewhere else?
  - c. Interoperability: Does it give access to my data to other tools?
4. If possible, look for Open Technologies first

# Fix 2: Regulation

**Regulate stronger privacy to neutralise the business model**

**Mandate interoperability to break down walled gardens  
(EU's DMA for example)**



# Fix 3: Change the Moral Imperatives

**Buy better sourced technologies!**

**Good:** Somewhere with better privacy laws (EU or similar)

**Better:** Australia!

**Best:** West Australia!

**Make a market for local products, we export the expertise on how to do this to other countries because we don't buy it here!**

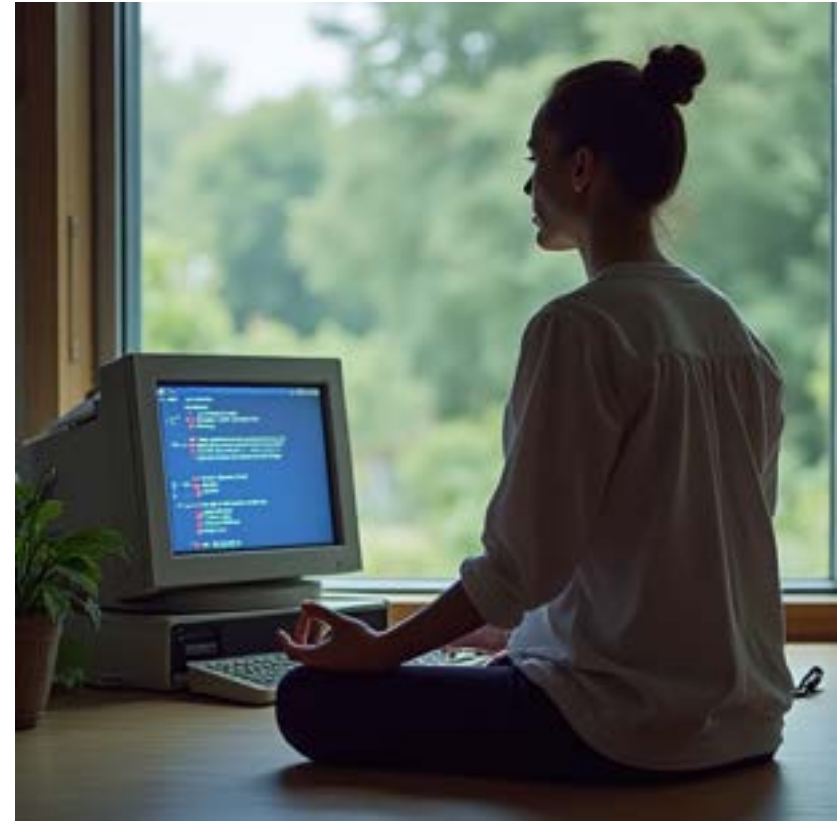
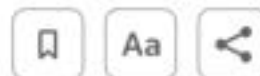
